PURPOSE: To give students the opportunity to be adjudicated performing before a judge. Each student will receive a written critique and a gold, silver, bronze medal, or a participant’s ribbon. A Gold Medal Winners’ Recital and Awards Ceremony will be held the day following the auditions.

ELIGIBILITY

- **Teachers entering participants must be active members in good standing of PMTA.**
- Teachers and students must abide by the “**Student Responsibilities and Guidelines**”, located at the top of the registration form.
- **Teachers must abide by the “Teacher Responsibilities”.**
- Students entered must have studied with the current teacher at least three (3) months before the registration deadline.
- Teachers may enter any number of students. Chairperson(s) may enter students.

REGISTRATION DEADLINE: Postmarked (no drop-offs) or completed online by **October 4, 2024.**

DIVISIONS: Elementary I (grades K-3) – minimum level 1
Elementary II (grades 4-5) – minimum level 3
Intermediate I (grades 6-7) – minimum level 5
Intermediate II (grades 8-9) – minimum level 7
Advanced (grades 10-12) – minimum level 9

CATEGORIES : **Category A:** Student must perform two selections memorized. Students will be awarded either a **Gold, Silver, or Bronze Medal, or Participant Ribbon**

Category B: Student performs two selections **for evaluation only** – memory optional. Students of any age, including adults, may register in Category B. No medals can be awarded – **Participant Ribbon** only.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- Type or print all information on the registration form. **Include title, key, opus number, movement of sonatina or sonata. Incomplete registration will not be accepted.**
- List the pieces in order they will be performed. Performance order **CANNOT** be changed on the day of auditions.
- **Repertoire CANNOT be changed after registration.**

REPERTOIRE

Elementary 2, Intermediate 1 & 2, and Advanced: each student is to perform two pieces:

- The first piece is any piece of your choice from the Baroque or Classical period.
- The second piece is a waltz, nocturne, or mazurka from the Romantic or Modern period.

Elementary 1: each student is to perform two contrasting pieces.

Only original compositions by composers of renown are acceptable. Arrangements/simplified versions are not allowed. Jazz, ragtime and blues are not acceptable. **WTC Preludes and Fugues by J.S. Bach must be considered as one piece** (they cannot be played separately). One movement of a sonatina/sonata will be considered as one piece.

For reference purposes, teachers may consult the Arizona Study Program Teachers Reference Guide 2016 (available from ASP).

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Auditions will be open to the **family members only** and if the participant wishes to have an open audition.
- If a student has received a superior, a superior with distinction rating or honorable mention in the Dean & Carolyn Elder Competition, the student may not use the same repertoire for the Fall Festival.
- **Once the schedule is published, scheduled audition times CANNOT be changed.**
- Teachers will be informed by e-mail of the Festival audition day after the registration deadline.
- Awards will be based on the entire performance. Because of time limits, judges may choose only one selection to be performed in the Gold Medal winner's recital. Choices will be recommended by the judge on the critique form.
- The judge's decision is final.
- Read the dress code for both events (auditions and winners' recital) on the registration form.
- Teacher will be notified of the Gold Medal winner(s) by late evening, Saturday, October 26, 2024.
- The Gold Medals will be provided at the Gold Medal Winners' Recital. Critiques and other awards will be available from the chairperson(s) within 2-3 weeks. No critiques or awards will be mailed.

TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES

- Review the "Student Responsibilities and Guidelines", located at the top of the registration form.
- Remind your students to abide the **dress code** and please be a good example for your students.
- **All teachers entering students in this event are expected to volunteer.**
- If you have questions, contact chairperson(s) prior to submitting registration forms.
- All communication with students and parents will be the teacher's responsibility.
- Questions and comments pertaining to any phase of this event must be conducted between teacher and chairperson(s) only.
- To avoid disqualification, teachers may not introduce themselves to the judge.
- To avoid disqualification, teachers must enter correct information regarding students' grades.
